

An Advent-ageous time of year.

- Approximately 130 Senior Boxes were delivered last month. We are planning for 80-100 during the winter months. The Social Ministry Committee feels that we can improve with more training. We are planning to show up early at 8:30am next Senior Box Tuesday November 26th.
- WNL continues to serve approximately 50.
- We are planning to serve a Thanksgiving meal on Wednesday the 20th. We will serve the meal with the people sitting at the tables.
- Blessing and Generosity bags are planned to be available by the 19 th. They will include items such as: toothpaste, soap, gloves, deodorants, etc. The Salvation Army is planning on a warming center meal at 6 pm on Thanksgiving. We are considering having our church bus available to bus people from the Arc Church to the Salvation Army center.

 - Precious attained his college degree as a Secondary school teacher and will be starting his first job in Lilongwe.
 - o Average number of children fed this year is 900, six days a week.
 - Number of boarding school students is 12.
 - Number of high school students is 86.
 - o Leonard Lobium sent a sincere thank you note to the Chikoti's and us for supporting his education. He is now in Level 3, pursuing Education Sciences.
 - o Construction work on the irrigation tank tower is almost complete.

Service Ministry


