



FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES & REPORTS

Tuesday, January 28, 2025-7:00 PM

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM.

Prayer and devotion led by Mike Anderson.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

• Electronically presented the FELC Church Council minutes from November 19 for approval. **MOTION** (Lu/Jan) to approve the minutes. **MOTION** APPROVED.

Pastor's Report, Jay Jackson:

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ.

2025 is off and running. I am still riding on the holiday high as I had the opportunity to experience Advent/Christmas at FELC. What a beautiful sanctuary when she is all dolled up for the holidays. Pastorally...

Lowell Weeks' funeral was a sad and joyful event. Much like life is for most of us. We are sad because such a loving heart has left us, and rejoicing because we will see him again. I had an opportunity to visit a few folks in the hospital as they were navigating health issues, but this is just a reminder that I am still an outsider, so if you hear of someone or know of someone that needs a visit, please let me know. I would rather be told numerous times, than not be told at all because we (naturally) assume that I have been told by someone else, and no one actually tells me.

I plan on doing a few home visits and extended care facility visits in the coming months, so please let me know if there is someone you know that would love a visit, and pray and discern if you might accompany me and introduce me as many if not all of the folks I'll be visiting don't know me. Lastly, Thank you.

To say we have had a rough start to 2025 is an understatement. We thank you for all of your prayers and support through the transition of our home challenges (which have gotten bigger) and through the loss of our sweet girl Daphne. Your prayers have been welcomed, coveted, and we ask that you continue to lift us up.

Daphne's funeral will be on February 15th (Saturday) so I would like to ask not to lead worship on the 16th, as I'm not sure what state of mind I'll be in.

We have plans in the works for so many exciting things here at FELC, but when life goes sideways, we adapt, and we pray, and we come together as a body in Christ. (Thanks Chris for that message).

Thanks again for what you do for the Kingdom, and I give thanks for your partnership in the Gospel, which means more now than ever before.

God Loves You and so do I.

Executive Committee:

- An E-Vote was held on December 9:
 - The Finance Committee **RECOMMENDS** a check in the amount of \$1473.38 to pay the seller's mortgage on the house he is purchasing so they don't lose out on it while the Maryland house has still not sold. This amount will be given as a loan to be repaid by payroll deduction over the next 3 months. This is an interest-free loan, and the Finance Committee will prepare a document for signature to authorize the deductions. **RECOM-MENDATION APPROVED**.
 - See the recommendation in tonight's Finance report for further action on this item.
- Committee reports (2024) for the Annual Meeting are due to the church office the first week of April.

- The Nominating Committee has begun their work in preparation for the May Congregational Meeting.
- **RECOMMENDATION**: Approval of the updated job description for the Director of Young Adult Ministries. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.** <u>Director of Young Adult Ministries</u> <u>Job Description.docx.pdf</u>
- We have to stay aware of potential changes to the federal grant and funding programs.

Church Council Group 1 (Financial/Property):

Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

From the *December* committee meeting:

- Bob Spears from Bo Lacey Construction was present to give us the quotes for both the Men's and Ladies' Bathrooms in the Undercroft. He gave us 2 quotes:
 - 1. Drywall Repairs, Flooring-Ceramic Tile, 12" x 12" Wall tile, Transition molding, FinishPlumbing Toilets, Ceramic Sink-Wall Mount-18" x 24", Vanity Faucet & supply lines, install Mirror 24" x 36", Install ADA blocking and grab bar, Trim Paint, Privacy Partitions, and in the mens room floor mounted urinals. This quote came in at \$149,487.96 for both the Men's & Ladies' Bathrooms. If we decide to do only 1 bathroom it will be half of that amount.
 - 2. The second quote is for all the same items except for doing the walls with ceramic tile, FRP Wall Boards will be used in their place. This quote came in at \$99,546.46 for both bathrooms, again if only one bathroom is done it will be half of that total.
 - The Property Committee voted on and passed the motion to hire Bo Lacey to do both bathrooms with the FRP Wall Boards upon the approval of the expenditure at the Congregational meeting.
- Other items discussed:
 - o Andy is still working on changing all the light fixtures to the new LED Fixtures.
 - o The Chapel still needs to be done. The second floor is 50 % done. The third floor is 75% done.
 - o Trees at the Retreat Center have been cut down. Charley Cordrey and James Murphy will be cutting them up.
 - Air Conditioning for the Emmaus Room is being installed this week by Standard Plumbing.
 - Andy is still getting quotes from Brotherhood Mutual and Church Mutual on coverage of insurance for the church. We should know soon which way we will be going on this issue.
 - Discussed about the hiring of a Commercial Cleaning company to help Dave keep the church clean. Andy spoke with Commercial Cleaning Enterprises and they gave him a quote of \$971.43/quarter to give substantial aid to Dave to keep the church clean. The Property Committee voted on and passed a motion to hire them on a trial basis to accomplish this goal.

Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship:

FELC (including the Early Learning Center) ended 2024 with total expenses of \$916,820, which was \$207,146 more than total income of \$709,675. Thankfully, withdrawals of \$173,630 from the General Endowment Fund and \$22,350 from the Major Capital Improvement Endowment Fund, along with the carryover of \$51,601, allowed us to meet expenses.

Our total offerings for the year were \$284,717, which resulted in Benevolence giving of \$28,472. We paid benevolences quarterly to the NALC, the NALC Seminary, NALC Disaster Response, the North Central Ohio Mission District, Malawi Orphan Care, Go Missions (Krafts), and the World Mission Prayer League (Sorges).

Offerings in 2024 were 10.3% higher than in 2023. Offerings have increased 16.2% over the past five years.

The General Endowment Fund ended 2024 with a balance of \$2,539,991, compared to the Year-End 2023 balance of \$2,243,323.

The Major Capital Improvements Endowment Fund ended 2024 with a balance of \$314,954, compared to the Year-End 2023 balance of \$273,899. At the January meeting, the Congregation approved the withdrawal of up to \$125,000 from this fund to renovate the restrooms in the Undercroft. Also, \$25,000 from this fund was committed to the antiphonal organ project, which will begin this year.

The New Ministries and Missions Endowment Fund ended the year with a balance of \$486,252. We did not take a draw from this Endowment Fund in 2024. There is also a New Ministries and Missions Fund (not an endowment fund) that carries a current balance of \$17,019. This fund and allowed withdrawals from the New Ministries and Missions Endowment Fund will pay for the new Director of Youth and Young Adult position for the next couple years.

FELC is very blessed indeed to have Endowment Funds and other funds that have come to us from generous members over time. Without our endowment funds, we would be unable to meet expenses.

The Finance Committee **RECOMMENDS** the forgiveness of the loan given to the pastor last month in the amount of \$1,483.73. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.**

The Finance Committee **RECOMMENDS** that the benevolence in 2025 be divided as follows:

- 25% NALC (combining NALC and the seminary because it is part of the NALC budget)
- 5% North Central Ohio Mission District
- 20% NALC Disaster Relief
- 10% Go Missions (Krafts)
- 10% World Mission Prayer League (Sorges)
- 10% Malawi Orphan Care Ministry Food Program
- 10% The New Store
- 10% Richland Pregnancy Services

 - o An entire bus load of young people went to Bolivia to help the missionaries there spread God's Word.
 - The Advent offering of \$1545 was sent in addition to the benevolence we sent for the 4th quarter.

On February 19th ELC will begin a fundraiser selling butter braid breads and cookies as we have in the



For the month of February we will be meeting on February 9, 2025 reading and discussing, *Lesson in Chemistry* by Bonnie Garmus.



Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an *average* woman. But it's the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel–prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with—of all things—her mind. True chemistry results.

But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show *Supper at Six*. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking ("combine one tablespoon acetic acid with a pinch of

sodium chloride") proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy. Because as it turns out, Elizabeth Zott isn't just teaching women to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo.

Laugh-out-loud funny, shrewdly observant, and studded with a dazzling cast of supporting characters, *Lessons in Chemistry* is as original and vibrant as its protagonist.
