

Global Missions Committee:

Sri Lanka

- Brian and Barb's Christmas celebration was shared with Islanders where they stressed Galatians 4:4-7. Their hearts were prompted to pray even more for "their dear Islander friends who continue to live as slaves, and don't know the freedom offered through the Savior."
- They are asking for prayers for good health for Barb. She has had more sickness than usual since their arrival in Sri Lanka.
- Need prayers for patience with themselves and continued energy to keep learning how to live in Sri Lanka.
- Barb's mother spent 2 weeks with them celebrating her 87th birthday on January 27th. They
 planned to take her snorkeling in the Islands!
- Romans 1 and 2 Corinthians are the only unfinished books in the New Testament that need to be completed in the Islanders' language. Pray that God will smooth the way as the work continues.

Malawi

- Two teams are planning trips to Malawi this summer. One leaves from May 18 to June 2. Their focus will be teaching Bible school at the MOCP. Joy Jones is also planning to check their finances while there. Supplies are also needed: flannel and clothing (shirts and dresses). The 2nd trip is from June 18 to July 1 (a medical team of 4-7 and small business information will be their focus)
- The feeding program needs funding because of inflation. Cost has gone up from \$85,000 to \$120,000 per year.
- The Chikotis plan to come here this summer has been moved to 2026.
- The farm was able to secure a government loan to take care of the 25 acres of maize planted.
- Construction work on the irrigation tower is now complete.
- The maize mill is working and is serving the community well.

From your Finance Committee.....

At our January congregational meeting, we approved a budget with total expenses of \$1,019,220, which includes the Early Learning Center budget of \$411,330 and a Property Committee budget of \$102,450.

We have estimated our Weekly Offering Income to be \$280,000 and income of \$420,000 from the Early Learning Center.

Each year, we draw from our General Endowment Fund to meet the budget. The specified withdrawal from this fund is \$139,744 for this year, along with some miscellaneous income leaves us a deficit of \$88,543. There was an additional draw of \$90,000 approved to cover this deficit.

At the congregational meeting, we also voted to withdraw up to \$135,000 from the Major Capital Improvements Endowment Fund to cover the costs of renovating the restrooms in the Undercroft.

We continue to do our best to be good stewards of all that God has blessed us with.

At the end of each quarter, we will tally all the giving (not including the Early Learning Center income) and give 10% of that total to the following:

- NALC (including the Seminary)
- World Mission Prayer League (for the Kraf's' missions)
- World Mission Prayer League (for the Sorges' Missions)
- NALC Disaster Relief
- Malawi Orphan Care Ministries
- Richland Pregnancy Services
- The New Store

Lent 2025 at First English Lutheran Church

March 5, 2025 – April 17, 2025

Lent is a traditional time of year, the 40 days before Easter, that many worship communities use to reflect on what Jesus has done for us on the cross. The forty days are reflective of the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by Satan. These forty days are a time to be intentional about renewing aspects of our faith, and in many cases streamlining our lives to line up with Jesus. It is a time when many traditions will engage in one or all of the spiritual disciplines. Solitude/Silence, Scripture immersion, Fasting, Prayer and many more.

All spiritual disciplines are designed to do one thing and only one thing. To draw us nearer to God. There may be additional benefits for our lives, but at the heart of the disciplines is the desire to grow nearer to God. Spiritual practices are a means to do so, when the goal, is a deeper relationship with Jesus and being nearer to our creator.

We will take an immersive look at a few spiritual disciplines during our Lenten journey. We will learn about them on Sundays as we look to find ways to utilize them in our everyday life, and we will go deeper on Sundays during the Education hour. We will also have an opportunity to learn and practice on Wednesday nights during this season.

I would invite you to go deeper in your relationship with Jesus these forty days and be a part of this time of reflection and engage with us together as we look to abide with Jesus more.

Wednesday March 5th – Ash Wednesday service @ 7:00pm

A time to remember that we came from the earth and we will go back to the earth, but have the hope of living with Jesus beyond our earthly lives.

- Sunday March 9th Introduction to the Disciplines, focus on "scripture" *Wednesday March 12th Meal and Immersive Teaching/practice "Scripture"
- Sunday March 16th The discipline of Prayer

Monday March 17th – Prayer Service (March of Prayer) @ 6:00pm

*Wednesday March 19th – Meal and Immersive Teaching/practice "*Prayer*"

- Sunday March 23rd The discipline of Solitude and Silence
 - *Wednesday March 26th Meal and Immersive Teaching/practice "Solitude"
- Sunday March 30th The discipline of Generosity
 - *Wednesday April 2nd Meal and Immersive Teaching/practice "Generosity"
- Sunday April 6th The discipline of Sabbath
 - *Wednesday April 9th Meal and Immersive Teaching/practice "Sabbath"
- **Sunday April 13**th Palm Sunday A Sunday to celebrate Jesus triumphant entry in to Jerusalem marking his eventual Kingship.
- **Thursday April 17**th 7:00 pm- Maundy Thursday A night of remembrance around Jesus' Last Supper.
- Friday April $18^{th} 7:00 \text{ pm}$ Good Friday A service of reflection for what Jesus did for us on the Cross.

Saturday April 19th – 7:00 pm – Easter Vigil Service. A night when we remember our baptism in light of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Sunday April 20th – Easter Sunday @ 10:00 am – A Celebration of Jesus' Resurrection from the Dead.

Lent can be a very powerful season of reflection, honesty, vulnerability, and growth. But it will only be valuable to the extent that you commit to it. I would ask that you pray individually to be part of a community that wants to immerse themselves in the life of Jesus, and these disciplines are just a beginning. The goal is to be like Christ. To do as he did, and to practice what he practiced. Each of these disciplines Jesus did in his life, and when we follow him, it means we follow what he did, because we trust him and believe in him.

One of the ways that we will also be able to discipline ourselves during this coming season, is to offer help and resources to others. Our Lenten offering this year will be going to the Salvation Army, as they have helped so many during this long, cold winter!

I look forward to walking the journey with you this Lenten season. I pray that you will engage fully with this season, making the disciplined life in Christ a priority over all other non-salvific tasks we enjoy as we live with the gift of life.







NALC Disaster Response Task Force is providing disaster preparedness training at Level One Basic and Level Two Specialized. These educational workshops will provide training to volunteers in each participating congregation, preparing each to form disaster volunteer teams. Each Mission District assists in the formation of teams and the preparedness training. Recognized credentials will be provided. Disaster Volunteer training includes components on:

Level One (unskilled disaster response for debris removal and basic information on FEMA regulations)

Level Two (specialized trainings) including:

- Case Management how to identify and track client needs and the assistance they receive – BECOME A VOLUNTEER CASE MANAGER!
- Donations Management how to coordinate and organize donated materials
- Volunteer Management how to identify the skills of each volunteer and address risk management issues – FORM A DISASTER VOLUNTEER TEAM & HELP REBUILD HOMES!
- Spiritual Christian Care how to identify and document qualified volunteers to provide spiritual care – PROVIDE SPIRITUAL CARE TO THOSE HURTING AND IN NEED!
- Congregational Facility Preparedness prepare congregations before disaster strikes WRITE A DISASTER PLAN FOR CHURCH FACILITIES! The disaster plan should address: Natural disasters such as fires, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, etc. Man-made disasters such as plant explosions, terrorist bombings, train derailments, etc. Active shooter protection as per state and local laws and programs, Medical emergencies, and Local Emergency resources such as County EMA and local law enforcement agencies
- Family Preparedness prepare families before disaster strikes, construct family preparedness kits GREAT SUNDAY SCHOOL PROJECT!




